- 00:00 And therefore, when I convened that general staff meeting, I did say to the whole staff, to the judges, to everybody: we are privileged. We are privileged people for having been called to participate in the administration of international justice.
- 00:21 We are privileged people for having been offered a position to fight against impunity. We are privileged people for having been invited to be part of a large team which is aim to render justice to the victims of the genocide committed in 1994 in Rwanda.
- 00:45 And therefore, from the judges down to the cleaners, each of us is only an element of a chain. Each of us has an important role to play and therefore, we have to do every effort so that we will complete our work as soon as possible.
