00:00 First, I think that the tribunal should in principle be in the location where the crimes occurred. Even if it cannot be done immediately, I think it's worthwhile to wait a couple of years and set the tribunal at that place. Also I think it's important to have local judges involved; not international judges alone.

00:23 I think that possibly the Sierra Leone and Cambodia solutions might prove to be better, because it's not a justice imposed from outside, but a justice which, in which the local judges or the I-, the I-, domestic courts intervene. I think that is important, because it also s-, serves then as a model for the local courts.
